Schedule of Classes

Spec Ed 3318: Inclusive Classrooms

June 15 - August 8; 3 credits

Introduces teacher candidates to inclusive education and characteristics of special populations in diverse classrooms. Students will learn issues related to compliance with state and federal laws and investigate Individualized Education Plans (IEPs) and other strategies to enhance collaboration among all students

Spec Ed 3349: Cross-Categorical Special Education

May 18 - July 11; 3 credits

Study of research-based instructional, behavior, and IEP writing strategies used to assist students with cross-categorical disabilities

Spec Ed 4323: Classroom Management and Positive Behavioral Supports

June 15 - August 8 or July 13 - August 8; 3 credits*

Teacher candidates will develop a culturally appropriate classroom management plan that includes procedures and strategies to address behavior problems and implement positive behavioral supports within inclusive classrooms.

Spec Ed 6325: Advanced Studies in Classroom and Behavior Management

June 15 - August 8; 3 credits

Students will learn to design, implement, and evaluate individual and group management programs with emphasis on functional assessment and positive behavior support.

Spec Ed 6412: Psychology of Exceptional Children

May 18 - July 11 or June 15 - August 8; 3 credits

An in-depth analysis of the unique psychological problems of exceptional children and youth. Emphasis is placed on current psychological theories and research

Spec Ed 6610: Foundations of Autism Spectrum Disorder

June 15 - July 11; 3 credits

Introduces students to the characteristics of children and youth with autism spectrum disorders (ASD). Students will explore trends and issues connected with ASD; and effective practices and strategies for structuring, managing, and promoting functional/behavioral skills development and interaction among children and youth with ASD.
