Schedule of Classes

Tch Ed 2209: Foundations of Teaching in American Schools

May 18 - June 13; 2 credits

Students explore the multiple roles and functions of professional teaching and other selected concepts and philosophies underlying American public education

Tch Ed 3210/6210: General Linguistics in TESOL

May 18 - June 13; 3 credits

An introduction to the historical, legal and pedagogical frameworks relating to TESOL

Tch Ed 3211/6220: Principles of Second and Foreign Language Acquisition

June 15 - August 8; 3 credits

Covers the principles of language acquisition and the factors which influence learning

Tch Ed 3212: Sociolinguistics and Communication in the Classroom

June 15 - August 8; 3 credits

Students explore the impact of society and culture on English language learners' academic language acquisition

Tch Ed 4391: Literacy for Adolescent Learners in Content Areas

May 18 - July 11; 3 credits

Examines the teaching of multiple literacies in the content areas. Implications of diverse cultures and languages and their relationship to reading will be explored.

Tch Ed 5312: Teaching Reading in the Content Areas

May 18 - July 11 or June 15 - August 8; 3 credits

Explores differentiated instruction as an approach to meeting the diverse literacy needs of all students in the classroom

Tch Ed 6010: Examining History, Community, and Social Justice in Education

May 18 - June 13 or June 15 - August 8; 3 credits

Addresses the issues of equity and social justice from the context of personal and educational history. This course will examine curriculum, instruction and learning through a variety of lenses including race, class, gender, ability, sexual orientation and religion and will inspire teacher candidates to become culturally responsive teachers.

Tch Ed 6020: Teacher Action, Advocacy, and Leadership

June 15 - August 8; 3 credits

Assists teachers to become advocates and leaders within the school and larger community for children, families, and the profession
